More To Think About:

1. How long are you going for?
 2. Remember to pack enough clothes. Which ones would be best?
 3. What season is it there -- what is the weather going to be like?
 4. What activities do you need to bring to plan for? Swimming; fishing; mountain climbing? What will you take?
 5. It is a nice idea to bring a gift for the people you will be staying with. What type of gift would be a good idea? Make or draw the gift.
 6. Oh No! Your bag is too heavy. What will you leave behind?
- Part C.** If you want to speak to the characters in the story, you may have to learn some words in their language.
1. Try to find out what language they might speak.
 2. If possible, learn enough words to say hello and good-bye, introduce yourself, be polite, and ask simple questions.
 3. Teach your new words to someone else and practice for your trip.
